The days are noticeably longer. Truly warm temps, for the first time this spring, may take hold. Our dark, cold, little world of Oceana County finally witnesses the start of its population explosion. Interestingly, much of the influx matches the area's year-round population. Young Hispanics and White retirees predominantly add to our established mix. As I've said, and as you already know, the Catholic future of our county is largely Hispanics and retirees.

The latter are attracted to our area's beauty, the former to work our fields and crops. One hopes for a significant portion of both groups to settle here - to strengthen and assure our Catholic future. Otherwise, we face stagnant growth that may flourish for a few summer months but that slowly withers and dies on the vine during the school year.

Local businesses, of course, may predict and plan accordingly, given the same demographics. However, our course of action as Catholics may lie closer to the heart. So much so that it calls for an examination of conscience, inspired by today's gospel. Christians especially are reminded that we are the vine and the branches; an interconnected human community; our brother's keeper. Our actions, and our failure to welcome and include, have consequences. For even if it is in the quietness of our hearts alone, and not our public prejudice, we may often whisper condemnations of the "others", however we may categorize and group them.

But this is not our personal task. Jesus is "the true vine" and God is "the vine grower." It is God who "removes every branch that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit."

We have no need to categorize and group others. For we do not know how God is pruning others, or pruning ourselves for that matter. And God is preparing us all, Hispanics, retirees, and all others, to flourish in growth and fruitfulness.

God looks at us, all of us, whoever we are, at whatever point we are in our lives, and asks that we "bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Do not fear nor categorize the other disciples. Instead, ask: Do we judge ourselves with the same sharp eye for mistakes that we have for those of others? Then, in this lovely county of ours, attempt to become one more firmly rooted in the soil that nourishes us all. Remain entwined with the vine, and pruned by the loving hands of the vine grower.

Los domingos de este mes se centran en los relatos de después de la Resurrección y en los grandes eventos de Pentecostés y la Ascensión. El mensaje central de todos ellos es, a simple vista, contradictorio: se pide la permanencia y al mismo tiempo se impulsa a salir a todos los rincones de la tierra. Es como una concentración del mensaje de discipulado misionero: permanecer en la fe y en el amor. Permanecer junto al Señor en la oración, como sarmientos unidos a la vid y, al mismo tiempo, salir a proclamar. No se puede quedar callado lo que se sabe y la gran alegría del anuncio. Es la naturaleza y la identidad de la Iglesia lo que se celebra en estos domingos. La victoria de la Resurrección no puede quedar en algo privatizado, sino que tiene que ir a todos los confines del mundo.

Hay varias celebraciones de santos importantes durante mayo, comenzando con la segunda fiesta de san José, san José Obrero, el 1 de mayo. Internacionalmente, éste es el Día del Trabajo; pero, en Estados Unidos, el amargo recuerdo de la masacre de Chicago, hizo que la fiesta se trasladara a septiembre. Otros santos de interés son Charlie, de Puerto Rico; Domingo Savio, un niño que dio ejemplo de gran santidad en una corta vida; Juan de Avila, gran predicador; Isidro Labrador; Pascual Bailón; y Felipe Neri.

Las grandes celebraciones marianas de este mes tan mariano en sí mismo son Nuestra Señora de Luján, patrona de Argentina, y Nuestra Señora de Fátima, que se apareció a tres niños pastores en Portugal.

4 DE MAYO - BEATO CARLOS CECILIO RODRÍGUEZ SANTIAGO (CHARLIE)



Fue el segundo de cinco hijos de una familia puertorriqueña muy cristiana. Recibió su fe, sobre todo, de su abuela. Siempre tuvo una salud muy frágil, que en ocasiones le impidió proseguir sus estudios, pero nunca se arrendó. Fue terciario benedictino. Trabajó como traductor de inglés a español y, con el poco dinero que podía ahorrar, publicó folletos de liturgia y cultura cristianas. En el Centro Universitario Católico de Río Piedras, organizó grupos de doctrina y estudios cristianas.

Animó a la renovación litúrgica de fieles y clero, y trabajó incansablemente por la participación activa de los laicos en la vida de la Iglesia. Se destacó, sobre todo, por su amor a Cristo y a la Eucaristía. Murió muy joven, afectado de cáncer.
