In the days following the publication of an extensive, wide-ranging interview with Pope Francis, the media in the US and around the world continued to marvel at a pope whose blunt talk sent what some called shock waves through the Catholic Church in the US and around the world. “Shock can be good sometimes,” said Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York, president of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, talking about the interview on “CBS This Morning”.



“At times the mystical body of Christ, the church, gets listless; it gets moribund, and we need a good shock; and I think that’s what he’s given us,” said Cardinal Dolan. “He’s a good physician; he’s a good prophet; he’s a good teacher; he wants to shake us up.”

“We should not be surprised at this interview,” said Georgetown historian and professor of theology John O’Malley, SJ, “because what the pope has put into words is what he has been telling us by his deeds and by his style ever since he was elected.”

Perhaps predictably, following the interview, many of the mainstream media reports focused on what Pope Francis had to say about modifying, not dogma, but the manner of the church’s encounter with gay and lesbian people and in offering instruction on important issues like abortion and contraception. Many media outlets jumped on the pope’s suggestion that the church had committed too much rhetorical space to these matters in a manner that could be detrimental to its overall moral message and its preferential option for compassion, mercy and encounter.

Cardinal Dolan said: “What I think he’s saying is, those are important issues and we need to keep talking about them, but we need to talk about them in a fresh, new way. If we keep kind of a negative, finger-wagging tone, it’s counterproductive.”

Even as the pope’s words were embraced with astonishment by many who had wearied of the church’s roles in US and global culture wars, they raised concerns from other Catholics, who worried that they suggested a weakening of the church’s resolve in confronting the moral challenges of contemporary times. As if intending to assuage such anxieties, on the day after his interview appeared Pope Francis issued his strongest public words to date on abortion before a gathering of the International Federation of Catholic Medical Associations in Rome. Pope Francis affirmed the sacredness of unborn human life and linked its defense to the pursuit of social justice. “In all its phases and at every age, human life is always sacred and always of quality. And not as a matter of faith, but of reason and science,” the pope said.

The pope grouped together unborn children, the aged and the poor as among the most vulnerable people whom Christians are called especially to love. “In the fragile human being each one of us is invited to recognize the face of the Lord, who in his human flesh experienced the indifference and solitude to which we often condemn the poorest, whether in developing countries or in wealthy societies,” he said.

This pope who washes the feet of the poor, drives a beat up old car, carries his own bag, and lives in a simple room instead of the papal palace, teaches by example. He is refreshing, hopeful, challenging, and - quite simply - truly Christian. Fifty years ago this month Pope John XXIII initiated the Second Vatican Council. He said it was time to “throw open the windows of the church and let the fresh air of the Spirit blow through”. I see the Spirit blowing, and it is indeed refreshing.

## EN OCTUBRE CELEBRAMOS EL ROSARIO



Pregúntele a cualquier hispano quién le enseñó a rezar el rosario, y seguramente la respuesta será su mamá o abuelita. El Rosario, que significa corona de rosas, es una devoción mariana importante y es parte de la espiritualidad de la familia católica. Los hispanos a menudo llevan un rosario en momentos buenos y difíciles, como símbolo de protección de la Virgen María y algunos, la mayoría más jóvenes, incluso lo usan como adorno.

El mes de octubre está dedicado al Santo Rosario, una de las tradiciones mejor conocidas de la Iglesia católica. La tradición surgió cuando un dominico del siglo XV, llamado Alanus de Rupe fue visitado por María cuando oraba y hacía penitencia por su fracaso frente a las herejías que combatía. María alabo su esfuerzo y le dio un arma poderosa, el Santo Rosario, explicando sus usos y eficacia. Le dio la misión de predicarlo a otros. En el siglo XVI el papa Pío V introdujo el rosario en el calendario litúrgico romano como Fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario, que se celebra el 7 de octubre.

El rezo del rosario se ha practicado durante muchos siglos, y se considera una tradición familiar, fuerte y eficaz. Durante toda la historia santos y Papas, junto con muchos fieles han rezado el rosario diariamente y en tiempos de dificultad. Una de las mayores influencias para la difusión del Rosario durante el siglo XIX entre los católicos fue la del Papa del Rosario, título dado al Papa León XIII porque publicó nada menos que doce encíclicas y cinco cartas apostólicas sobre el Rosario e instituyó la costumbre católica de rezarlo diariamente durante el mes de octubre.

El P. William G. Most, en su obra *Mary in Our Life*, dice: “En un momento en que peligros mucho mayores que los de los turcos en la antigüedad amenazan no sólo a los cristianos, sino a la civilización, se nos urge a recurrir al Rosario en busca de ayuda. Si muchos hacen eso y llevan a cabo las demás peticiones que nos hace María, tendremos una mayor razón para la confianza en que seremos librados de todos los males”.

Además de ser un componente muy formativo de la vida espiritual para los hispanos el Rosario es un signo de esperanza, un modo de orar que no se puede comparar a nada. Tanto si es en nuestra oración diaria o en las celebraciones de triduos o novenas, el rosario juega un papel importante. Para quienes no lo rezan, éste es el momento ideal de empezar.
