NEWS NOTES

► The Archdiocese of New York announced April 19 an important next step in the canonization process for Dorothy Day: a canonical inquiry into the life of the co-founder of the Catholic Worker Movement and famed peace activist. The inquiry is being overseen by the archdiocese, which is sponsoring Day's sainthood cause, and it will examine Day's life with an eye toward doctrine and morals. If, after examining the information, the Vatican congregation and the Holy Father recognize Day's heroic virtues, she will be declared "venerable," the next step in the canonization process.

► For decades, Congress and U.S. presidents—both Republican and Democrat—have approved federal laws "protecting conscientious objection to abortion," but it is increasingly clear current laws "offer far less protection in practice than in theory," said a group of faith-based, health care and pro-life organizations. A group of 26 organizations made the comments in a joint April 19 letter to member of the House of Representatives urging them to pass the Conscience Protection Act of 2016, or H.R. 4828. The letter pointed to several loopholes in current law that is said would addressed by the Conscience Protection Act, introduced March 22 by Reps John Fleming, R-Louisiana, and Vicky Hartzler, R-Missouri. Among the signers of the letter are the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops; the Christian Medical Association and Catholic Medical Association; the National Council of Catholic Women; the March for Life Education and Defense Fund; the National Association of Evangelicals; the Southern Baptist Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission; the Knights of Columbus; National Right to Life; and several associations of physicians and nurses.

► As youth from around the world flocked to Rome for a Year of Mercy event for teens, Pope Francis on April 23 made an unannounced visit to St. Peter's Square, where he joined more than 150 priests hearing confessions. A Vatican spokesman said the pope "listened to the confessions of 16 boys and girls." In his homily during Mass with teenagers at the Vatican the next day, Pope Francis said: "Your happiness has no price. ...it is not an app that you can download on your phones."

When we follow the news—locally, nationally and world-wide, it's clear that we really are a global community. What happens in our country affects the world; what happens in the world affects our country. We take pride in saints that we can claim as our own, and we embrace saints from cultures foreign to us. We're not alone in our struggle to defend life, from inception to natural death. And we're not only enthralled, but proud of a pope who is a true pastor. He's a wonderful example of being Christian in a global society. He cares for the poor, stands undauntingly for justice, speaks out fearlessly for what is right, isn't afraid to challenge, has pastoral priorities—and he listens. He embodies the intent of Pope John XXIII when he said: "Throw open the windows of the church and let the fresh air of the Spirit blow through." This man genuinely is led by the Spirit. He challenges teens—and us.
