A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE: Jesus sat down for a meal and was caught between the weeping woman and the indignant Pharisee. Why is it tough issues always pop up at meals? No wonder we need antacids. Jesus focused on the positives, offering forgiveness to the woman and understanding to the Pharisee.



A young boy had just gotten his driving permit. He asked his father, who was a minister, if they could discuss the use of the car. His father took him to his study and said to him, "I'll make a deal with you. You bring your grades up, study your bible a little and get your hair cut and we'll talk about it." After about a month the boy came back and again asked his father if they could discuss use of the car. They again went to the father's study where his father said, "Son, I've been real proud of you. You have brought your grades up, you've studied your bible diligently, but you didn't get your hair cut!" The young man waited a moment and replied, "You know Dad, I've been thinking about that. You know, Samson had long hair, Moses had long hair, Noah had long hair, and even Jesus had long hair...." To which his father replied...."Yes, and they WALKED everywhere they went."



In April 2014 President Obama announced an initiative to expedite the clemency application process for

federal inmates, many of whom would have already finished serving their time if sentenced under today's less harsh guidelines.

This week's Muskegon Chronicle noted the reduction of a Detroit-area man's sentence for a drug crime. Kareem Martin has been in prison since 2007. His 23-year sentence now will expire in 2018. Obama commuted the sentence Friday along with the sentences of 41 others.

In 2006, Martin pleaded guilty to possession with intent to deliver cocaine. Federal Judge Lawrence Zatkoff noted a "long history of criminal conduct" and said a "significant sentence" was appropriate. Martin's sentencing guidelines were enhanced by his past convictions. He's been seeking a shorter sentence for years. In 2014, Martin wrote Zatkoff, saying he was a "changed man" who had become an electrician while in prison.

Another of these is Norman Brown, who in 1993 was given a sentence of life without parole—a punishment the sentencing judge said was too harsh—for distributing crack cocaine, the minimum mandated because of his two previous minor drug offenses. For 24 years Mr. Brown kept his head down and his hope alive. Today he is one of the 248 prisoners who have had their sentences commuted by President Obama.

Thousands of men and women are still waiting to have their cases reviewed by the Department of Justice. An estimated 1,500 of the 9,000 pending applications meet the administration's strict criteria for commutation: nonviolent, low-level offenders who have served at least 10 years with a demonstrated good record in prison. But what Mark Osler, a professor of law at the University of St. Thomas, calls a "sluggish and often intransigent review process" may prevent most of these cases from even being considered.

That would be a shame. In this Year of Mercy, it would be most fitting for President Obama to use his unique power of pardon to give prisoners a second chance to rebuild their lives, reunite with loved ones and contribute to society.

"We respect the humanity and promote the human dignity of both victims and offenders. We believe society must protect its citizens from violence and crime and hold accountable those who break the law. These same principles lead us to advocate for rehabilitation and treatment for offenders, for, like victims, their lives reflect that same dignity." US Conf Catholic Bishops

El amor es lo que salva
Las lecturas y su mensaje



2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13

Al profeta que pronunció la promesa dinástica le toca ahora pronunciar la acusación. Se diría que el oráculo de Natán personaliza la ofensa como hecha a Dios. en rigor, se diría que David ha ofendido a Urías; pero el Señor toma por suya la ofensa. ello crea un nuevo sistema de relaciones. David es el rico malvado en la parábola. Con relación a Dios había sido el elegido y tratado con cariño especial. Al abandonar ese papel, toma el puesto del rico y ofende a su Señor, el cual se convierte en vengador del pobre. La apertura trascendente de la persona a Dios y el interés personal de Dios por la persona confieren su grandeza y gravedad a la caridad y la justicia humana. La respuesta de David es brevísima: iluminado por la Palabra se descubre como es ante Dios y confiesa sin comentario su pecado contra el Señor. Dios perdona anulando la sentencia de muerte.

Gálatas 2:16, 19-21

Pablo expresa la más profunda experiencia de fe del cristiano: sabemos, hemos creído. Su saber y su creer es Cristo, cuyo nombre menciona ocho veces en los siete versículos y ocupa el evangelio de salvación que anuncia. Frente a este evangelio está el evangelio falso de la observancia de la fe que pretendidamente justicia. La visión de Pablo va más allá de la fe judía; abarca toda la ley, toda ideología, todo proyecto humano. Pablo recuerda insistentemente que solo la fe en Cristo salva, no la ley, pues "por cumplir la ley nadie será justificado". Solo la fe en Cristo es la que hace saber y experimentar la condición de pecadores y por otra parte el perdón y la oferta gratuita de amor salvador de Dios.

Lucas 7:36—8:3

La escena de la mujer que se acerca a Jesús mientras comparte la mesa en casa de un fariseo es el marco perfecto para que Jesús establezca la distancia tan enorme que hay entre el legalismo y la apertura a la experiencia de la novedad del reino. Jesús enseña una lección muy importante: ni el cumplimiento más riguroso de la ley, ni las privaciones, ni la separación en que viven los piadosos fariseos, ni el sentirse bueno, conmueven a Dios. Solo el amor y el reconocimiento interior de ser pecador atraen la misericordia y el perdón de Dios.

Nuestra cultura:

En la cultura hispana, las relaciones personales y la atención a cada persona siempre han sido mucho más importantes que las reglas, los horarios o las normas. Aunque es posible que haya que mejorar algunas cosas en ciertos casos, el respeto por la dignidad de la persona sobre toda otra cosa es un valor muy importante y significativo en esta cultura.
